Summary: Studying literary texts plays a pivotal role in promoting self-awareness and intercultural understanding. Literature serves as a mirror reflecting diverse human experiences, fostering introspection and empathy. By delving into characters and narratives from various cultures, students gain insights into different perspectives, values and societal nuances. This exposure cultivates a heightened sense of self by encouraging individuals to question their assumptions and broaden their world view. Furthermore, literary exploration nurtures intercultural understanding, breaking down barriers by illustrating the common threads of human emotion and experience that transcend cultural boundaries. In essence, the study of literary texts becomes a powerful tool for fostering empathy, enhancing self-reflection, and fostering a more interconnected and harmonious global society. In this workshop, we will follow Junior High School students on their journey to mindfulness and intercultural understanding through the study of the novel "The Silver Sword" by Ian Serraillier.
