Since its founding in 1925, Athens College continues to incorporate the best of Greece and the US in its educational programs and through its leadership and governance and has enhanced the Greek curriculum with an emphasis on balanced excellence blending rigorous academics with innovative co-curricular and community service programs.



FROM OUR BOARD CHAIRS

My years as a student at Athens College have been the most formative of my life. I deeply love this School, it has made me who I am today and I know that my classmates and all of our alumni would say the same. During my school years, my classmates and I were challenged on a daily basis academically, physically and personally, coming from a diverse student body from privileged and underprivileged families united in our common values of ethos and intellectual pursuit.

The world has rapidly changed since then, becoming increasingly competitive, defined by international standards with technology and globalization transforming radically the ways we live and conduct business. Athens College hasn't always been agile enough to adopt the necessary forward thinking innovative behavior required to meet these changes. We owe it to our youth and to our School's legacy as a true center of excellence and beacon of education in Greece and beyond, to gain ground on this front in order to best equip our students for global citizenship.

While completing my second year as Chairman of the Board of Directors, I am confident you have appreciated the major necessary changes and improvements we have implemented during these past 2 years. There are undoubtedly more to come.

We are working as one with our Board of Directors, the Board of Trustees and the President in order to maintain our academic leadership, meeting the demands of academic quality in the 21st century, while ensuring a strong international focus and a more open and transparent College. We have diversified our student body by expanding our Merit and Need Scholarship Program, enhanced academic excellence by initiating Merit Awards, re-instituting the President's List of Academic Achievement and implementing International Baccalaureate programs that inspire exploratory learning and critical thinking across all school levels.

I once read that Athens College resembles a massive ocean liner ill-suited to 180° turns and although we are making significant progress there are times when we face resistance to change. As our School's alumni, parents and friends, I count on you as School ambassadors to help us enable the ocean liner to take its turns smoother, supporting us in any shape or form, whether that means underwriting a scholarship, sponsoring a program, sharing your expertise, getting involved in school events or volunteering your time.

This past year has been productive in many ways and we are proud of what we have accomplished so far. Working together as a team with Chairman Nicolas Tsavliris, our Board of Trustees, Board of Directors and the President we have initiated significant and necessary changes towards the advancement and welfare of our School. Yet, we are also cognizant that much remains to be done and we would like to share with you our priorities.

Our students were challenged in an academically rigorous environment. We learned how to read, we learned how to write and we learned how to think. We respected the rules but were not afraid to challenge authority. Even more importantly, our teachers taught us to respect our elders, our peers and those less fortunate than us. We learned that what matters most in life is good character. We were a diverse student body from privileged, underprivileged and diaspora families united in our shared values of good character, intellectual pursuit and academic achievements.

Regrettably we have lost ground in terms of the academic rigor of the School. Some has been the result of restrictive government policies, some the result of an erosion in values in a rapidly evolving society and some the result of our own mistakes. Academic excellence requires a merit based admissions system, merit based scholarships, faculty development, curriculum development and a rigorous evaluation of everyone involved, students, teachers and administrators included. These initiatives have been eroded and need to be restored.

At the same time, we are no longer the leading "international" school in Greece. Greece's membership in the European Union changed the secondary school landscape with the emergence of the IB and the increased competition from foreign schools. As the regulatory environment for Greek schools became more restrictive the flexibility built into Athens College's founding law has eroded.

The values that earned Athens College the remarkable reputation we have enjoyed for a long time are even more important today than they were in the past. The world has become a smaller place increasingly defined by international standards. Our students will be called upon to compete against the best, both in Greece and around the world. We are determined to help them meet this challenge and you should rest assured that working together as one we will succeed.

Library & Science Buildings

The central Library and Natural Sciences Building are built, thanks to USAID/ASHA grants, gifts of the American people. Two decades later, the Athens College Theater was constructed through a new USAID grant.

Coeducation & Elementary Education

Athens College becomes co-educational. The pioneering Bodossakis Elementary School is inaugurated. In 1978, this innovative facility wins the Distinguished Building Award by the Chicago Chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

Psychico College

Following unprecedented growth in enrollment, Psychico College is established. The Latsis Elementary School is inaugurated in 1995. In 1984, the Adult Education Program is launched.



Benakis Hall

The College's landmark building, Benakis Hall, is inaugurated on May 25. During World War II it is occupied by the German army and later serves as a British military hospital.



Community Outreach Program

The College launches its Community Outreach Program with students and alumni participating in the post-war reconstruction and equipping of provincial schools throughout the country. The College today partners with a wide variety of NGOs in Greece and abroad, giving students hundreds of opportunities for hands-on service learning.



Fellows Program

The Athens College Fellows Program launched, bringing recently graduated young Americans to campus. Today, the College hosts the largest number of US Fulbright Fellows of any institution in Greece. Fellows work with students across divisions as mentors, coaches, advisors, role models and more.



ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS 2018 - 2019

Athens College has an outstanding legacy of academic excellence while learning is an active pursuit that takes many shapes and forms. There is no one set track record for students here. The opportunities are limitless. For yet another year, we are very proud that our students have excelled in so many different areas. More specifically to name a few:

- Our 2019 graduates have achieved excellent results in their final exams and were accepted to top-rank universities in Greece and abroad such as Brown, Columbia, Dartmouth, Yale, Pennsylvania, Cambridge, Imperial, LSE, UCL, Bocconi and many others.
- They won the Young Entrepreneurship Award in Greece and two awards in the Junior Achievement European Competition in France, while our School received the Entrepreneurial School TES Award 2019.
- Our High School students were distinguished at the Panhellenic and European Union Science Olympiad EUSO 2019 in Portugal.
- They triumphed in the Panhellenic Biology Competition 2019 and were part of the Greek National Team for the International Biology Olympiad in Hungary.
- They participated in the Greek National Physics Team and received an Honorable Mention at the 50th International Physics Olympiad in Israel.
- They have won leading places in Panhellenic, European and International Sports and Athletics Championships, as well as in Forensics Association Tournaments both in Greece and abroad.
- Our Elementary Schools became members of the European Talent Support Network and were recognized as Talent Points within 400 institutions worldwide, which are dedicated to the common objective of talent development.
- Our Junior High and High Schools are now members of the "Global STEM Alliance" of the Academy of Science in New York.

We are proud to implement the International Baccalaureate continuum across the School, by becoming an authorized MYP World School and by receiving a candidacy as a PYP World School.

OUR INNOVATION IN LEARNING

Kindergarten

The "John M. Carras" Kindergarten provides a unique, exciting learning experience and builds a solid foundation for students' future academic, social and emotional trajectories. It offers a dual language pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten program for children aged 4 - 6 that focuses on the development of the whole child and prepares them to be good communicators and knowledgeable, caring and open-minded learners. Currently in the process of becoming a certified school for the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (PYP) in the Early Years, the Kindergarten offers an interdisciplinary curriculum with a wide range of arts-oriented and STEM activities and provides its young learners with opportunities to discover the world through play in a safe, diverse and nurturing environment.

Elementary School

The Athens College Elementary School offers students ample opportunities to develop personally, academically, socially and emotionally. While employing the Greek national curriculum, the School is also a candidate to become certified for the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (PYP) and encourages its students to make sense of the world around them and take ownership of their own learning. Through student-centered teaching methods, students focus on key areas of learning such as communication, language and literacy, problem solving and reasoning, physical and creative development. They are exposed to a wide variety of globally significant ideas and issues in their day-to-day learning whether that be science, language, math and the arts or extracurricular activities. We aim to help our students develop solid study skills, positive attitudes and become caring and responsible global citizens.

Junior High School

In Junior High School students continue to build on the knowledge, skills and attitudes they develop at the Elementary School level. Junior High implements the Greek national curriculum and is also an International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (MYP) authorized school. Students are exposed to a wide range of real-world issues, have the opportunity to connect knowledge across subject areas and develop skills that will enable them to become well-rounded and autonomous learners. We empower students to ask challenging questions, to know themselves, to develop responsibility and care for others through service learning and achieve excellence on their own terms. At the same time the students' academic experience is enriched by a wide range of clubs and extracurricular activities in both academic and non-academic areas including forensics, robotics, fencing and many more.







High School

High School students continue to follow the MYP curriculum where they meet the Greek national curriculum requirements. At this grade level, students also complete a Personal Project, which is an essential part of the MYP, giving them the opportunity to explore their passions, build awareness of their own learning processes, develop research, thinking and self-management skills and demonstrate their understanding of core values, while experiencing firsthand the process of inquiry, action and reflection. The students' Personal Projects are externally moderated against globally set criteria. In grades 11 and 12, students can choose to either exclusively follow the Greek national curriculum, which is enriched in all subject areas, or to follow the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (DP). Whichever path they opt for, we make sure to successfully prepare them for university studies both in Greece and abroad.



International Baccalaureate

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB DP) is now recognized in almost every country in the world as one of the pre-eminent university-entrance qualifications for students studying outside of their home country. At Athens College, the IB DP has been offered since 1996, with an impressive track record of academic achievement and acceptance rates in the most reputable higher educational institutions in the world.

Our DP is one of the largest in Europe, it is rigorous in nature and takes pride in offering an extensive range of subjects within the six main subject areas taught, thereby giving learners an opportunity to keep their options open and discover what their passion is. The skills that they develop within the two years of the IB DP include research, data analysis, academic writing, public speaking, project management, time management, leadership and becoming active in a global community, which allows them to settle comfortably into a new environment when they join foreign universities.



Lifelong Learning

Athens College believes in empowering its faculty to be the best educators they can be. Our program for continuing professional development Educate the Educators is a dynamic teaching and learning program developed by educators for educators. Members of our faculty deliver inspiring lectures and run hands-on workshops not just for our teachers but for the wider educational community as well. This way best practices and areas of expertise are shared across the board giving all our educators the opportunity to benefit.

The College has also run an Adult Education Program since 1984, which is the largest one in Greece. Offering a very diverse range of afternoon and evening courses to adults, this program aims to broaden their knowledge for both personal and professional enrichment. Foreign languages, sports, social science and culture, the arts and business are all included in its course offerings.

An Athens College education empowers students for life. Everything we do – every class, every piece of music, every sport, every presentation, every extracurricular activity and every act of community service – is meant to help our students discover their interests, their power and their responsibility as future global citizens and leaders. To learn to think critically and creatively. To write and speak persuasively. To listen respectfully. These skills are honed in classrooms, clubs, competitions, student publications, community engagement and more. An integrated English Language program across the Institution ensures students acquire native-language fluency.

Acquire problem-solving skills

Our experienced STEM educators (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) challenge students to think their way around a problem and try out solutions. Well-equipped and staffed labs support learning opportunities within and beyond the curriculum for students at every level.

Channel their creativity

Passion for the arts electrifies campus. Students have access to art studios, theaters, performance rooms and more. Multiple opportunities and resources encourage students to explore interests, push creative boundaries, perfect skills. They learn from a team of talented teachers, as well as visiting artists, performers and scholars.

Appreciate sportsmanship & healthy living

Whatever their skill, all students participate in athletics. From beginners to elite athletes, our students learn to value good health, lifelong commitment to fitness and the joy of sport. One of the most successful K-12 athletic programs in Europe, instructors and coaches cultivate a competitive spirit, fair play and team loyalty. Thanks to our supporters, our athletic facilities serve students, alumni and the wider community.

Contribute to the common good

Service to the community is a part of school life that is shared and valued by every graduate. Our students volunteer their time and talents through community partner organizations at the local or national level, participate in service trips, and join summer programs with international organizations.

OUR FULBRIGHT FELLOWS

We are honored to host the largest Fulbright Fellows Program in Greece. The Fulbright Foundation awarded 13 fellowships to recent graduates from leading Universities in the USA to gain educational experience at Athens College. The Fellows provide a unique cross cultural educational experience infusing their culture, enthusiasm, ideas, language and knowledge into our school community serving as role models for our students.

Being a Fellow at Athens College Elementary School has challenged me and allowed me to grow as an educator in ways that I couldn't imagine. As a person from an underrepresented background, I have been able to learn just as much from the students and this unique culture as they have learned from me, and the knowledge gained from this experience will forever enhance my role as an educator.

WHERE LIFE CHANGERS ARE MADE

We believe that community service is a powerful mechanism for change. Through our rich and diverse community service and International Baccalaureate programs (Creativity - Activity - Service, Service as Action) our students learn to help others, expand their worldview, develop empathy and come to understand their responsibility to take action for positive impact.

Every year we partner with more than 135 local and global NGOs, including Greenpeace, Action Aid, Elpida, Make a Wish, UNICEF and WWF to give students hands-on, service learning opportunities.

Students also lead and act in partnership with other students through campus service clubs and independent projects. Our staff and students have worked together on some of the country's -- and the world's—most pressing challenges.

We continue to partner with The Home Project, an NGO founded by an Athens College graduate, supporting unaccompanied refugee children through tutoring and peer-to-peer mentoring on campus. This year, we travelled to the remote island of Kastellorizo with NGO Axion Hellas and gave a tutorial to local students as part of our "Speak Truth to Power" Human Rights Educational Program funded by the Robert F. Kennedy Foundation. We also donated books to the school library of Kastellorizo, as part of the "Books to Remote Islands" project initiated by our "John M. Carras" Kindergarten.

Alumni often point to their shared efforts with classmates to make an impact on those in need as the most formative experiences of their lives. Since 1949, students and alumni have rebuilt, equipped and maintained more than 20 severely damaged schools in the most remote islands and rural areas of Greece. Today, hundreds of Athens College graduates are leading and serving nonprofit and public service organizations around the world.

OUR STRATEGIC INITIATIVES

Build a more diverse & inclusive student body

By embracing our differences, we believe that our community will become more open to the world. The College is committed to expand the number of Merit & Need Scholarships and welcomes academically talented students with limited economic resources. Thanks to the generosity of donors, 29 new Merit & Need Scholarships were awarded in 2018-2019 for students entering Junior High and High School following competitive entrance exams, interviews and home visits. Together with the 18 Merit Scholars enrolled last year, half of which are on the President's List of Academic Achievement, we have reached a total of 47 Merit Scholarships. At the same time, we recognize the importance of continuing the School's Financial Aid program for students whose families are facing unforeseen hardship in these difficult times.

We are examining reinstating the College's boarding program on a modest scale to host students from throughout the country, as well as those whose families work or live abroad as an opportunity to reinforce the values of civility, honesty, generosity and concern for the common good. A student residence also opens up new and innovative programming possibilities for summer exchange, visiting teachers and scholars, weekend symposiums with the participation of students from throughout the country and beyond – and so much more.

Better prepare our students for global citizenship

In a rapidly changing and interconnected world, today's most successful schools integrate global citizenship education and 21st century, non-cognitive skills. The strength of Athens College has always been in enhancing the national curriculum, delivering it through innovative pedagogy and giving students myriad opportunities to discover and hone their talents outside the classroom.

Community awareness and engagement have constituted core values and a distinguishing feature of Athens College throughout its history. In this day and age, we need to also commit to helping our students better prepare for real life problems, global collaboration and competition through addressing the relationship between them as individuals in Greece and in the world.

With these concepts underpinning the International Baccalaureate philosophy and Athens College offering the full spectrum of IB programmes (PYP, MYP and DP), there are now multiple opportunities for meaningful action to be inspired, planned and carried out.

We believe that education gains value when it encourages students' active participation in projects that address issues of a social, economic, or environmental nature for purposes beyond themselves. Instead of addressing community service as an extracurricular component of school life, the IB framework at Athens College acts as a way to integrate community service with instruction to enrich the learning experience, teach civic responsibility and strengthen community ties. Students exercise the flexibility, perseverance and confidence they need to bring about positive change in the wider community and beyond. This ensures that meaningful service learning opportunities are now available to all students and become a recurring everyday practice with a profound and lasting impact on the entire school community.





FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Athens College completed the 2018-2019 academic year in a solid financial position. Despite the continued adversities resulting from a shrinking Greek economy, we started the year with maximum enrollment and operated within our annual budget. Our challenges today are to keep the School affordable for our students, meet the uncertainty of Greece's economy through a combination of conservative budgeting and careful day-to-day management and continue to make needed investments in our educational programs to maintain and continually improve quality.

Moving forward, it is clear that we must diversify and increase revenue streams, including private support through gifts and grants. Donor contributions to the Institution, its reserved funds and endowment provide a critical source of funding for Athens College and ensure the College's financial stability for the longer-term future. With the establishment of the new Development Office in 2018-2019, new fundraising efforts were initiated to meet growth targets requiring greater community participation, including the Annual Fund that supports both student financial assistance and meets the gap between tuition and the cost of educating all of our students.

All gifts, irrespective of amount, help the College deliver the quality education for which it is recognized while concurrently serve the mission and vision of its founders. Gifts are fundamental as they reduce dependence on tuition revenues, provide a predictable source of income, attract exceptional students, enable the development of innovative programs, alleviate maintenance costs, allow campus improvements and help make up the Athens College experience.

Creating a substantial surplus is a strategic priority that will allow us to sustainably strengthen our financial aid in the future, funded through donations, income from the endowment and the annual operating budget. Currently financial aid for needful students represents 6% of our revenue, with 29% secured from the collective efforts and donations of the greater College community.

Although demand for an Athens College education remains high, many of our families face financial difficulties during their children's years at the School. Applications for financial aid have more than doubled since the start of Greece's economic recession approximately ten years ago.

In 2018-2019, revenues totaled $\le 54,938,667$ and total expenses (including $\le 1,492,438$ in amortization) amounted to $\le 53,936,969$, leaving an operating surplus of $\le 1,001,698$ that will reduce the College's deficit. Our longer-term strategic priority is to put operating surplus towards reserved funds and the endowment to help ensure the Institution's future.







GOVERNANCE

Athens College, also known as the Hellenic American Educational Foundation, is a private, non-profit educational organization governed by a Board of Directors in Greece, which collaborates with a US Board of Trustees based in New York (Board of Trustees of Athens College in Greece) in order to promote the Foundation's goals. The members of the two Boards, many of whom are alumni, are distinguished professionals who volunteer their services.
